

Frequently Asked Questions

Nursing Undergraduate Programme

Q. Which undergraduate nursing programmes do you provide at De Montfort University?

Answer:

1. Bsc Hons – Nursing Single Registration. Pathways include:- adult nursing or mental health nursing or children's nursing or learning disability nursing.
2. BSC Hons – Nursing with dual registration. Pathways include:- September intakes: any two fields of practice in combination. January intakes: adult & mental health in combination.
3. Bsc Hons – Nursing – decelerated route. Single registration over four years. Pathways include:- adult or mental health or child health or learning disability .

Commencement dates: September (all fields of practice, duel and decelerated pathways) and January (adult & mental health, dual and decelerated pathways.)

Q. What are the entry requirements for the Programme?

Answer: For 2012 entry: 5 GCSEs (grades A, B or C) or equivalent, must include English Language or English Literature, mathematics and a science subject or equivalent qualifications.

280 points from a minimum of two A levels including two subjects at grade C or above, or equivalent qualifications.

IELTS – score of 7:0 in all categories.

Occupational Health check, declaration form and Enhanced CRB clearance prior to the start of the programme
Successful at interview (SKYPE interview can be offered)

Q. How long is the programme?

Answer: 3 years full time / four years full time for dual qualifications and decelerated pathways

Q. How do I apply?

Answer: Though UCAS, or direct to DMU via the website dmu.ac.uk

Q. How is the programme structured?

Answer: 50 % theory and 50% practice.

Q What is the cost of the programme?

Answer: £ 10 750 per year of Programme, plus travelling expenses when in practice and accommodation and living costs. These fees are for 2012/13 entry, and are subject to change.
