What are workplace mentors?

As part of the apprenticeship programme, each apprentice is assigned a workplace mentor within their organisation. The workplace mentor is there to help the apprentice to learn, continue and complete their assignments. Mentors are there to help with any work-based questions and share best practice and experience.
