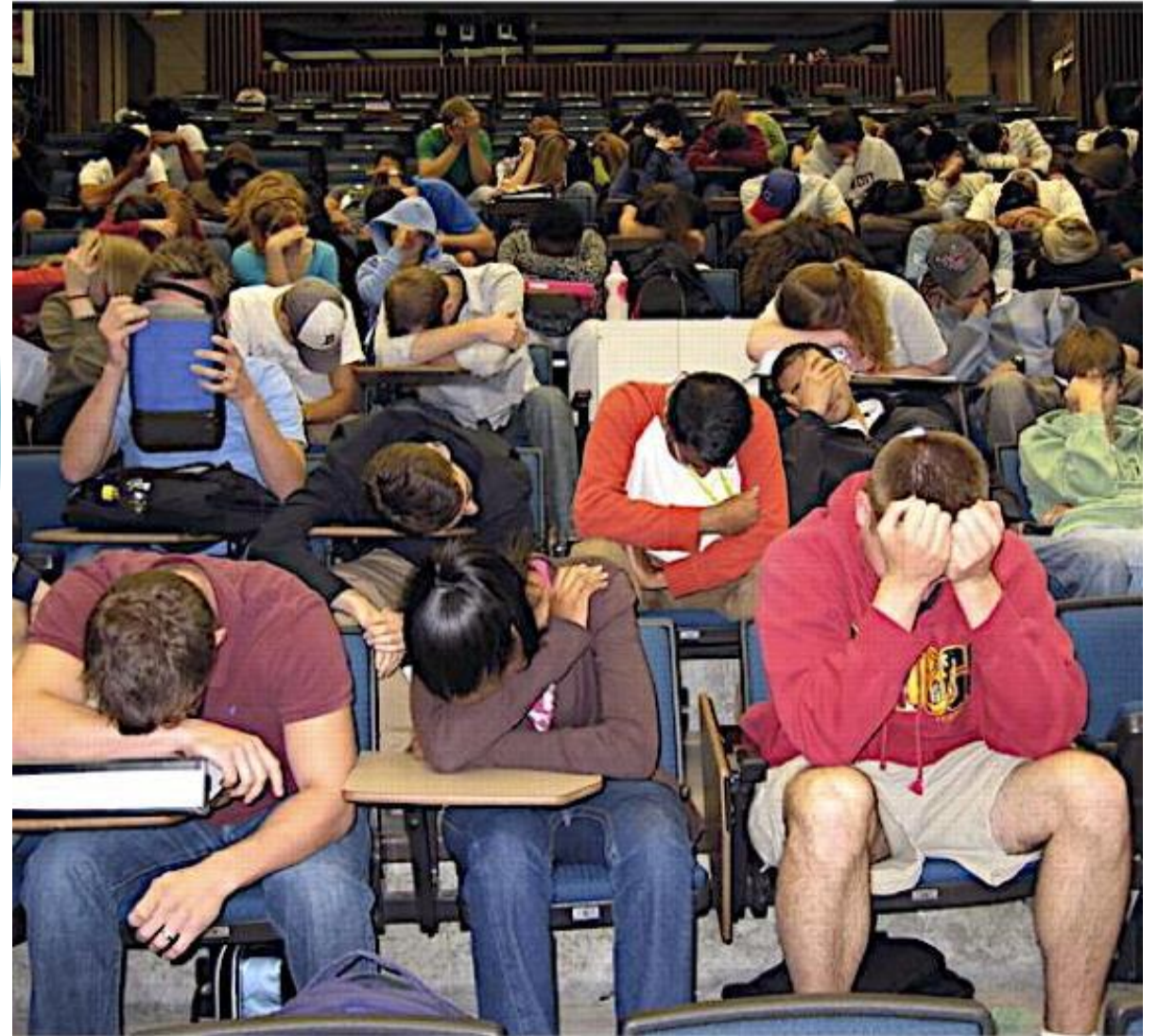

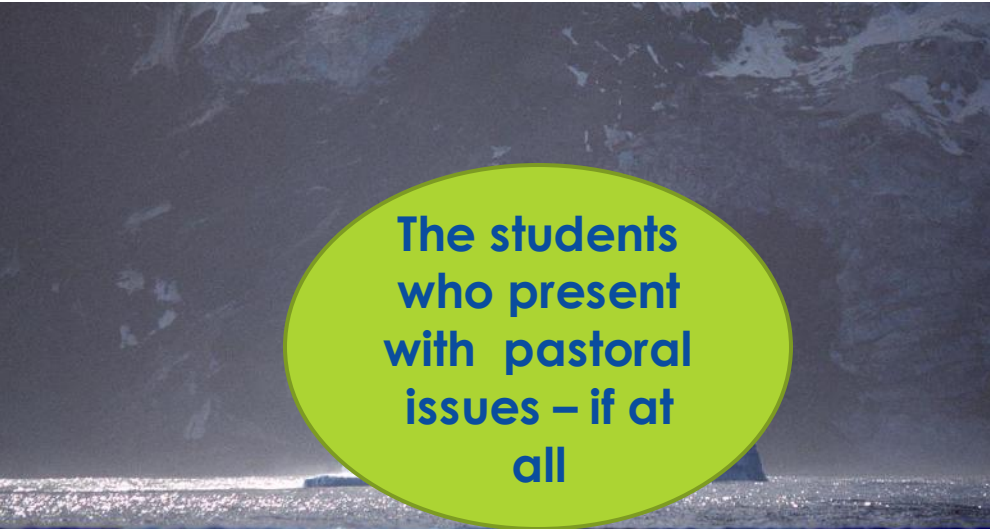

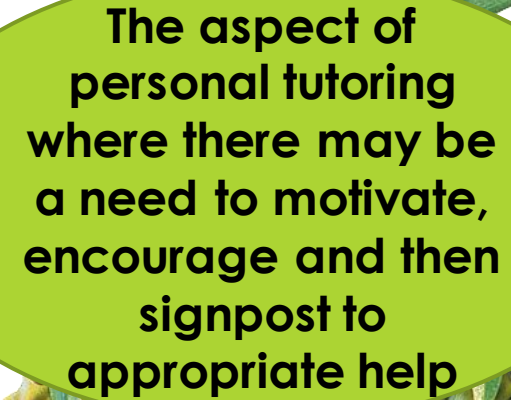





The students who present with pastoral issues – if at all

Underlying issues that may not be recognised in terms of academic fails or personal issues not known to the personal tutor if at all or until at a crisis point – this could include financial/personal/single point of access referrals
