With our innovative modular teaching approach you'll focus on one subject at a time for deeper learning and better results. It's a gamechanger for your learning experience and professional success.

This modular approach is designed to help you learn your subject in depth and also to support your professional success by developing strong skills for lifelong learning.

You'll have regular assessments and feedback rather than lots of exams at the end of the year.

Not only does this format help your learning, it often reflects how workplace projects are structured. This means you'll boost your employability by building the skills employers want such as problem-solving, time management and team-working.

## How it works

Whether you're thinking about shared or en-suite bathrooms, extra space to socialise, or on-site facilities, there's an option to suit you.





# Apprenticeships and Higher Technical Qualifications

**We recognise that there is more than one route to achieving your ambitions and more than one type of learning experience. If you're looking to get career-ready through a shorter, industry-driven route, or you want to study alongside work, there is a pathway for you at DMU.**

Funded by the government and your employer, apprenticeships give you the chance to earn, learn and gain a qualification in the process.

DMU's Higher and Degree Apprenticeship programmes cover topics including data analysis, management, cyber security, paramedic science and nursing.

You'll develop the skills, knowledge and experience to excel in the workplace.

Each apprenticeship is designed around specific work-based skills that employers are looking for.

## How do apprenticeships work?

As an apprentice, you'll spend most of your time on the job, and the rest studying at DMU. Available apprenticeship roles are advertised on the national government website, UCAS website and recruitment websites. If you already have an existing job, you can approach your employer for their backing.

We work with employers such as IBM, Caterpillar, Specsavers, Leicestershire Police and East Midlands Ambulance Service.

You'll have access to our online support and resources, so you'll be able to study alongside your work commitments. You'll also be assigned a mentor to support you in the workplace.

## Funding for your apprenticeship

Apprenticeships are covered by government funding claimed via your employer. If your employer does not pay the Apprenticeship Levy, the Government will pay for 95% of your apprenticeship with your employer contributing the remaining 5%. For those aged 21 or below at the start of their apprenticeship, the Government will fully fund all of the apprenticeship training and assessment costs.

## Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs)

Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) are level 4 and 5 qualifications developed with employers and approved by Skills England. Level 4 HTQs include Certificates in Higher Education (CertHEs) and Higher National Certificates (HNCs); Level 5 HTQs include Diplomas in Higher Education (DipHEs), Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) and Foundation Degrees.

The HTQ quality mark assures employers that you have developed the required knowledge and skills to succeed and are ready to start your career.

HTQs are available to both sixth form/college leavers as well as adult learners who wish to upskill/re-skill/change career or who may need additional qualifications to achieve a promotion. Unlike an apprenticeship, you do not have to be employed to undertake an HTQ, and because they align to the very same Occupational Standards as apprenticeships, HTQs provide equivalent career-specific higher-level learning that will give you an edge and set you on your chosen career path.

Also, with an HTQ you have the option to continue your studies and top-up to a full degree – the choice is yours.

## How do HTQs work?

Courses can be completed within one year for level 4 and two years for level 5. They are also stackable, meaning you can take breaks between modules, and stack the credits over time, learning at your own pace.
