Fresher Reps are DSU student volunteers who will be on hand throughout FreshFest 2011 to ensure that you settle in and make the most of your first week of University life.



SPORTS TEAMS


The Exec Office (Level 1, opposite the social area) is your first stop for all Sports and Society based queries.

Sport & Activities at DMU is diverse and extremely well organised, thanks largely to the student-led mentality that underpins the multitude of clubs and events.

With over 100 different activities being run, The Students Union covers all bases. However, if there is something you are interested in and it's not represented – then please feel free to start up your own sports club or society!

Catering for all tastes & cultures – with activities as diverse as Ultimate Frisbee, Burlesque and the Demon Laser Society, all the way through to Internet Gaming, Poker, the Gospel Choir and the Christian Union.

Running alongside these we also have over 25 staple sports including Football, Rugby, Hockey, Rowing and Netball all competing in weekly BUCS competition against other universities.



Benefits:

The benefits of playing sports and staying active are obvious, but more important is the opportunity to meet new people and improve your social life. Ask any club member what the best part of their club is and the banter that surrounds your chosen activity is sure to be high on the list. Socials, meals, nights out and club tours will make your time at DMU even more memorable.

& SOCIETIES

Responsibilities:

To get involved with a sports team, you must first become a member of "DSU Active". A one off fee of £32 will allow you to join as many teams as you wish throughout the year. This fee covers you for all affiliation, membership and registration costs, personal insurance and travel costs associated with your chosen team, with all monies being channelled back into each sports club.

DSU Active cards are mandatory for all participating students. No card, no play.

To join one of the many societies sees a one-off fee of Σ 2. This Σ 2 goes directly to the society in question. There are no limits to the amount of societies you can join, so get out there and get involved.

Fresher's Festival Sports Fair (Wed 28th Sept):

Attendance is an absolute necessity, with the Students Union providing the arena for our army of sports clubs & societies battling it out for your membership. Each club has a devoted stall, manned by a squadron of committed players & committee all trying to gain your elusive name on their sign up sheet. Everyone is welcome, with all abilities catered for. The emphasis is less on elite sports performance, but more, the opportunity for everyone to get involved as much as possible.

Taster Day (Sat 1st Oct):

To start the academic year off with a sport fuelled explosion, the DSU Taster Day provides free use of all our sporting facilities and free taster sessions across all participating clubs, enabling you to sample a new sport or activity that you may have previously never experienced before. This is also a great chance to meet new friends and get involved straight away. So start the year as you mean to go on and shop-around before deciding.

Demon Media consists of 3 strands:



The Welfare and Education Centre is a confidential, impartial and independent advice service provided by your Students' Union. We can advise you on virtually any welfare or course related problem whilst you are studying at DMU.

We help with everything from one-off simple advice to long-term support with on-going issues. We can also provide representation for DMU students both within the university and externally so for example, we can represent you at a DMU disciplinary or academic offences hearing or in court to recover your housing deposit.

We can help you navigate the red tape, get your argument made in the strongest possible way and give you all the support you need.

- Finance (including debt & student funding)
- Immigration
- Academic
- Employment
- Complaints
