Collaborative Partnership Network

DMU has collaborative partnerships with a number of colleges and institutions in the UK. The 'collaborative arrangements' are where courses are taught either completely or in part at the partner college or institution.

Students studying on a programme that is validated by DMU and delivered by a partner, means students are enrolled at both the University and the partner and therefore they can take advantage of the facilities and resources of both institutions. The qualification obtained at the end of the programme is a DMU Higher Education Award.

Having been established for over 20 years, with over 1,700 students, DMU's collaborative partnerships are mature and well developed. The students studying at our partners represent a significant student body within DMU. The University and its partner colleges and institutions are highly experienced in teaching and supporting collaborative partnerships.
