Keynote Session: Student Engagement and Transformation: A Twin Track Approach

Professor Colin Beard will explore student engagement from two extreme perspectives, namely that of utility and ambivalence towards knowledge versus deep engagement and meaning perspective change that supports transformation.

The talk will relate theory to practice with reference to a pedagogy called 'Walk the Talk' where epistemological development requires an understanding of the complex spatially related web of knowledge in order to grasp the essence of the evolution of the environmental movement.

However the recognition of a parallel ontological development track can help raise lecturer awareness and promote the generation of approaches that support the shift towards more transformative modes of student learning.

The role of the sensory and emotional intelligence in moving to transformational learning approaches will be highlighted, and the concept of the 'edge zone' will be introduced
