- 1. This Level 3 programme is 120 credits but has no identified transferable award. Successful completion provides entry to specified degree programme. The English Language modules are must pass TEAP0101 English for Academic Purposes 1 (30 credits) & TEAP0102 English for Academic Purposes 2 (30 credits). TEAP0101 is a pre-requisite of TEAP0102. To manage progression between these must pass modules a mini assessment board will be held at the end of term 1 to ratify the results of TEAP0101 and where students have not passed they will be able to exceptionally progress into term 2 carrying the fail which is to be retrieved in term 2 with additional tutor support.
- 2. Compensation is permitted in 30 of the remaining 60 credits.
- 3. Whilst the IYZ is a Level 3 programme the DMU Standard Taught Regulations will apply, noting the exceptions below

#### Compensation

Compensation is available for module failure in the International Year Zero, provided a student meets the following criteria:

- An overall module mark of 30-39 per cent has been achieved
- A minimum of 90 credits, including 'must pass' modules at that level have been passed
- •The average mark for the level is 40 per cent or above Compensated credits are limited to a maximum of 30 credits

The IYZ does not allow compensation for marks between 30-39% in the English for Academic Purposes modules (60 of the total 120 credits).

#### **Reassessment of Failure**

The IYZ does not allow compensation for marks between 30-39% in the English for Academic Purposes modules (60 of the total 120 credits). Students may be reassessed in up to 90 credits of modules per level of study.

#### Eligibility criteria for undergraduate awards

The IYZ is an unclassified pass/fail award. Students will receive a transcript of their module results, but do not receive a transferable award. There are no exit awards for the IYZ programme.

#### Maximum periods of registration

The IYZ has a maximum registration period of 2 years full time
