7. Programme-Specific Regulations

7.1 This Level 3 programme is 120 credits but has no identified transferable award. Successful completion provides entry to specified degree programme(s). There are English Language modules in semester/term 1 and 2 which are both must pass. The semester/term 1 English module is a pre-requisite of the semester/term 2 English module. To manage proceeding between these must pass modules a module assessment review will be held at the end of semester/term 1 to review the results of the semester/term 1 English module and where students have not passed, they will be able to continue into semester/term 2 carrying the fail which is to be retrieved in semester/term 2 with additional tutor support.

7.2 Compensation is permitted in 30 of the remaining credits.

7.3 The DMU Academic Regulations for Undergraduate Programmes will apply, noting the exceptions below.

Reassessment of Failure

7.4 Students will have two reassessment opportunities in each module to retrieve one or more failed assessment components. These opportunities may be via in-year reassessment; however, third assessments may not always be available in-year due to different delivery patterns or availability of support.

Eligibility criteria for undergraduate awards

7.5 The IYZ is an unclassified pass/fail award. Students will receive a transcript of their module results, but do not receive a transferable award. There are no exit awards for the IYZ programme.

Maximum periods of registration

7.6 The IYZ has a maximum registration period of 2 years full time.
