
Multi-Dimensional Mentoring in Dubai '23

New home for live in-person forums

November heralds the start of group mentoring in earnest. There's a clear place for online mentoring forums in a post pandemic world, but as our in-person sessions ramp up once again, our Careers Hub in Hugh Aston, is the perfect spot to host our mentoring events.



November 2023 was fit to burst with both live and virtual mentoring forums. These sessions offer both mentors and mentees a chance to share wisdom in groups so that everyone gets the benefit from great questions and responses. Six evening forums engaged 20 scheme mentors, providing professional insight and wisdom to the questions of nearly 100 mentee attendances, in a mix of in person and online sessions.

What is a forum and why do we run them?

These are dedicated events, designed to provide both mentors and mentees a sample mentoring experience and hear a range of questions and responses. This allows mentors to gauge the mood when in comes to students needs and appetites for learning from those with experience. It also provides mentees the opportunity to consider the viewpoints of mentors from a variety of backgrounds, in order to compare and contrast wisdom, mentor character styles and industry experience. All of this can help inform how we match our mentors and mentees together and manage expectations going forward. A joy of the forum is seeing the mentors in action and the the students actively responding to the conversation with supplementary questioning, developing side chats with mentors and them too sharing their own experiences with the wider group.



A decade at DMU to remember
