You will consider how people learn and evaluate the factors influencing individual educational development, alongside language modules in either French, Mandarin or Spanish. During the course you will also explore the historical, social, cultural, philosophical, psychological and political development of the education systems in both the UK and internationally.

During your dissertation module you will be able to tailor your learning to your career interests, while a strong employability focus is maintained throughout the duration of your studies with voluntary placements in schools or other educational settings embedded in all three years of study.

Psychology BSc (Hons) This three-year degree enables students to explore education and learning, and develop an understanding of social, biological, cognitive, developmental and personality psychology.

You will examine how childhood is understood and shaped by society and how educationalists and psychologists theorise personal, social, emotional and intellectual development.

During your dissertation module you will be able to tailor your learning to your career interests, and you will be encouraged to undertake a voluntary placement experience towards the end of year one and continue to do so throughout years two and three in order to boost your employability.

Graduates from this programme will have opportunities to pursue education-related roles in local authorities, academy chains, nurseries and prisons, as well as in arts, cultural, community and alternative education roles. Many of our recent graduates have gone on to initial teacher training programmes or continued on to postgraduate study, including our Education Practice MA programme.


It means that DMU has been found to deliver 'consistently outstanding teaching, learning and outcomes for its students. It is of the highest quality found in the UK.'

- Hospital and prison education settings


You will also have the opportunity to undertake optional trips at home and abroad, through our career-enhancing DMUglobal and DMUlocal initiatives.
