

WHAT IS THE HEALTH POLICY RESEARCH UNIT?

The Health Policy Research Unit (HPRU) consists of academic staff with substantial research interests in the field of health policy. The Unit aims to promote high quality research by:

- Bringing together researchers with a variety of interests, skills and expertise
- · Collaborating with other organisations involved in health policy research
- Facilitating the development and submission of research proposals
- Promoting the effective dissemination of research findings.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Collectively the Unit has a wide range of interests which focus on four main areas:

- Public Health including the social and economic context of health, health and ethnicity, health promotion, healthy lifestyles and infection control
- The Health Professions including professional regulation, the regulation of alternative and complementary therapies
- Public Participation in Health and Health Care including lay involvement in health and health care, NHS complaints, the role of patients' organisations
- **Health Service Reform** including reorganisation, restructuring and the management of change in the NHS and Public Private Partnerships.

Undertake commissioned research


