

Frequently Asked Questions

Midwifery Undergraduate Programme

Q. Which undergraduate nursing programmes do you provide at De Montfort University?

Answer:

- 3 years full time direct entry leading to a BSc(Hons) in Midwifery
- 18 month full time programme for registered adult nurses
- Both give eligibility to register with the Nursing & Midwifery Council.

Commencement dates: September (all fields of practice, dual and decelerated pathways) and January (adult & mental health, dual and decelerated pathways.)

Q. What are the entry requirements for the Programme?

Answer:

Five GCSEs or equivalent at grade C or above, including maths, English language and science plus one of the following:

- 280 UCAS Points with at least 240 from three A Levels including at least one subject from a Science or healthcare Science subject (excludes General Studies), or equivalent
- International Baccalaureate: 28+ Points including at least one of biology, chemistry, physics or psychology at Higher Level
- Occupational Health check, declaration form and Enhanced CRB clearance prior to the start of the course.

Q. How long is the programme?

Answer:

- 3 years full time / four years full time for dual qualifications and decelerated pathways

Q. How do I apply?

Answer:

- Though UCAS, or direct to DMU via the website dmu.ac.uk.

Q. How is the programme structured?

Answer:

- 50 % theory and 50% practice.

Q. What is the cost of the programme?

Answer:

- £ 10 750 per year of Programme, plus travelling expenses when in practice and accommodation and living costs
- These fees are for 2012/13 entry, and are subject to change.
- Travelling expenses when in practice and Accommodation Living costs
