We can come to you

We can deliver a number of inspiring talks and activities on site at your school or college.

The activities below give you a flavour of what we can offer, but feel free to ask if you need something bespoke. All of our talks are flexible in content and duration, and can be tailored to fit in with your timetable and careers curriculum.

1) WHY HIGHER EDUCATION AND MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE

This presentation explores some of the common reasons why students choose to move on to Higher Education and provides advice about what to consider when short listing course and university choices for the UCAS application.



Duration: **30 – 40 minutes**

2) STUDENT LIFE

This talk, delivered by a current DMU Student Ambassador, looks at all aspects of university life from a student's perspective. This session provides students with an ideal opportunity to get a genuine insight into what life is like beyond sixth form or college.



Duration: 40 minutes

3) APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY: AN **OVERVIEW**

Providing students with a chronological overview of the UCAS process and the key deadlines which students need to be aware of, this talk offers tips on how best to complete the application and make a positive first impression. The talk also includes clarification of the different types of offer students may receive and how to reply to these.



Duration: 30 minutes

4) WRITING AN EFFECTIVE PERSONAL **STATEMENT**

This presentation provides information and advice on how to write a positive personal statement. It includes an overview of what the personal statement is, why it is important and what admissions tutors are looking for. It also provides guidance on what a good structure looks like, how to form effective sentences and includes some top tips using examples from past personal statements.



Duration: **30 – 40 minutes**

5) SUCCEEDING AT UNIVERSITY **INTERVIEWS**

Many students who are invited to attend an interview as part of the university application process are unaware of what to expect. This talk aims to equip students with knowledge of what happens, what admissions tutors are looking for and provide hints and tips on how to prepare before the day.



Duration: **30 minutes**

6) A GUIDE TO STUDENT FINANCE

Student finance and funding is an increasingly important consideration for students. This presentation provides a comprehensive overview of the current student finance and funding arrangements. The talk also includes top tips on how to budget as a student to make funding stretch even



Duration: **30 – 40 minutes**

7) STUDENT FINANCE: HOW TO APPLY

This presentation is suitable for students who already understand the student finance system. It explains what the finance application form looks like, what information is needed, what parents/ sponsors need to do and what happens between submitting the application and starting university.



Duration: 20 – 25 minutes

8) DON'T BLOW THE BUDGET

A hands-on activity designed to let students have a go at budgeting! Students are allocated a set amount of funding and have to decide how best to spend their money, with decisions to be made as to which items are essential, and which are luxuries. Students will learn how to budget effectively and will discover how much a typical student spends on university accommodation, food, transport etc.



Duration: 40 – 45 minutes

9) PREPARING FOR RESULTS DAY

Results day can often be a bewildering time for students. This talk helps students understand the processes surrounding the day and explains the actions which students will need to take both if they secure their place at university and if they don't.



Duration: 25 minutes

10) PREPARATION FOR UNIVERSITY

Ideally delivered when students are starting to think about making the transition from school/college to university, this talk includes advice and guidance about what to prepare before you go, what to do once you arrive and how to make the most of the first few weeks.



Duration: 25 – 30 minutes

11) WHY DMU?

This informative talk will give students an insight into De Montfort University with an overview of what's on offer - both academically and as part of the wider student experience. The talk is highly flexible and can be tailored to focus on a particular Faculty or subject area to fit with your students' studies.



Duration: 25 - 30 minutes

12) TALKS FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

We also offer a range of talks specifically designed to address the concerns of parents/carers supporting a student through the university application process. Popular talks include Student Finance for Parents and Why HE? and How to Apply, however we can tailor any of our talks to suit an audience of parents/carers.



Duration: flexible

13) HE INFORMATION STAND

We are able to attend any university or careers fairs you may be holding in school/college to give students the opportunity to collect literature and ask questions about Higher Education and De Montfort University.



Duration: flexible

14) LECTURE PROGRAMME FOR SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES

We have a number of academics who are able to come out to visit your students and deliver a taster academic lecture. Lectures are available in a variety of subject areas and are designed to expand your students' subject knowledge, challenge their abilities and provide them with that all-important insight into what it's like to study at undergraduate level.

1) YEAR 12 UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE DAYS

Our bespoke University Experience Days include a variety of sessions to inform and inspire about Higher Education. You can pick a number of activities from our suite of talks and include a campus tour, HE Quiz and Student Ambassador Q&A Panel to create an interactive day. The day is supported by Student Ambassadors who are all current DMU students, which offers your Year 12s a fantastic opportunity to have their questions answered by those who are currently experiencing university life.



Duration: one day

2) FESTIVALS

One day subject Festivals will take place in late June 2014 and will offer students from Years 10, 11 and 12 the opportunity to take part in a range of taster lectures and seminars from different courses and subject areas. In 2013, we successfully ran two Festivals 'It's all about ME' Media and English Festival and 'Time to take Part' Performance Arts Festival, and we are looking to increase the number of festivals for 2014 to include different subject areas. Festivals are free to attend and more information will be sent out to schools in early 2014.



Duration: one day

3) RESIDENTIALS

Each July we run residential summer schools for Year 12 students to give students the experience of studying, socialising and living at university! Places on the residential are free of charge, but numbers are limited so we recommend an early application to secure a space. Dates are yet to be finalised, but please put July 2014 in the diary and await further information during the year.



Duration: three days, two nights

4) OPEN DAYS

Coming to visit us at an Open Day is a great way to find out about what it's like to be a student at DMU. From taking a tour of the campus, to getting the chance to speak to our lecturers and students, DMU Open Days really do give visitors the chance to see it all! University-wide Open Days take place on selected Saturdays through June to November. If you would like to bring a group of students and/or parents to one of our Open Days please get in touch with the team who will be able to facilitate a group booking for you.

5) DEGREE SHOWS

Throughout the year our Faculties of Art, Design and Humanities and Technology open their doors to the public to showcase the skills and work of our final year students. Prospective students are very welcome to come and view the creative and innovative displays to discover more about what the course involves and to speak to our students. School groups are particularly welcome to visit our Degree Shows, and students often leave motivated and inspired to achieve. To find out more please contact the team.


