Life on campus


Campus offers loads of great places to eat, drink and relax, including the popular Riverside Café, which specialises in vegetarian and vegan cuisine and overlooks the River Soar, and the spacious Food Village, where you can order food from all over the world. Our Campus Centre is the home of De Montfort Students' Union, enhancing your student experience with extra break-out spaces to study and chat.

Our Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Leisure Centre boasts a 25-metre swimming pool, climbing wall, eight court sports hall, fitness suite, dance studio and a packed programme of workout classes for all fitness levels.

The Kimberlin Library offers a space where you can work and study, with access to a vast range of print materials, guidance from staff and facilities for individual and group work. Computer stations, laptops, plasma screens and assistive technology are also available.

Simulate what it's like to work in the financial industry with our Trading Room, complete with financial software reporting real-time stock and bond prices.

Our multimillion-pound media studios are equipped with editing suites, TV studios, and digital and analogue radio stations.

DMU looks to provide accommodation that caters for what matters most to our students and their parents and carers. We aim to find every new student a safe and affordable place to live where they feel at home.

All DMU sourced rooms are modern and self-catered, with single-sex options available and many featuring en-suite bathrooms, social spaces, on-site gyms and internet access. There's also an opportunity to handpick your own room. Bede Hall offers fully adapted rooms for wheelchair users, including kitchens.

We understand that safety is key, so all DMU-sourced halls have on-site or on-call security, on-site managers, and CCTV or electronic door entry.



Tuition fees for international students

We set our fees so that students receive a high-quality and distinctive education while enjoying excellent facilities and a fantastic experience. Currently, international student fees are:*

- BA/BSc (Hons) (including a foundation year or year zero) / MPharm / MDes degrees: £14,750 - £15,250 per year
- MA/MSc: £15,100 - £18,780

DMU expresses its entry criteria using the UCAS Tariff points system or the International Baccalaureate (IB) points system. The points awarded for A-levels are as follows:

A* = 56	B = 40	D = 24
A = 48	C = 32	E = 16

English language requirements

The majority of our courses require an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of 6.0 or 6.5, with a minimum of 5.5 in each component. However, some courses require a higher IELTS score due to professional accreditation requirements.

English language

Our dedicated Centre for English Language Learning (CELL) offers a range of courses designed to help you improve your language skills, before and during your studies.

The centre is accredited by the British Council for the quality of its teaching, so you can be sure you are receiving a high standard of English language tuition. Our highly experienced tutors have travelled the world teaching English language to students and other teachers.

Our pre-session courses are intensive English courses that can be taken in the summer before starting your degree course. If your degree offer is conditional on English language, this pre-session programme will allow you to meet your conditions without the need to take a further International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test.

To join a pre-session course you will need to submit a valid Secure English Language Test (SELT) result. Depending on your offer conditions and your level of English.

2 Receive an offer

Once your application has been processed you will receive one of the following decisions by email:

Unconditional Offer – you meet the entry criteria. Your place will be reserved until you accept or decline your offer.

Conditional Offer – you still need to submit outstanding documents. Your place will be reserved until you meet the rest of the entry criteria.

Alternative Course – you do not meet the entry criteria for your chosen course but you are suitable for another course.

Reject – you do not meet the entry criteria. We will always offer an alternative course where possible.

3 Accept your offer

To accept your offer you will need to pay a deposit of 50 per cent of your tuition fee. Payment can be made at dmu.ac.uk/epayment

4 Confirmation of acceptance for studies (CAS)

Once you meet all of your conditions and have paid your deposit, you will receive an email with your CAS letter three months before the start of your course.

5 Arrange your finances

You will need to arrange for the remainder of your fees (minus your deposit) and living costs to be in your bank account for 28 days.

6 Apply for a visa

You can now apply for the Student Route visa.

7 Credibility interview

You may be invited to attend a credibility interview with the Home Office.

Visa information

In order to be awarded a student visa you will need to show that you:

- Have a valid Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) statement provided by DMU once you have been given an unconditional offer
- Can meet the English language requirements for a student visa
- Have paid your tuition fee deposit
- Can pay the fees for the first year of your course and living costs in the UK
- Have a proven record of studying
- Hold a valid passport

Conditions to become a student in the UK

You should provide the following information to support your visa application:

- Your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number from DMU.
- Copies of the academic qualifications your English language test score (if applicable). These documents must match those that have been written on your CAS statement.
- Bank statements to show that you can pay for your studies and your stay in the UK. The account can be in your name, or in your parent or legal guardian's name. There must be cash funds in the bank for a period of 28 days, ending no more than one month before the date of your visa application.
- ATAS Certificate (if applicable): you may need to apply for a valid ATAS certificate to submit with your application.
- Tuberculosis (TB) test - if you are applying from a country that requires this.

Credibility interview

Please make sure that you take all of the original paperwork to the visa credibility interview. You will be expected to talk knowledgeably about your course and demonstrate your motivation for studying it.

Sponsored students

If you are a sponsored student, you will need to show evidence of government or employer sponsorship and a letter of confirmation from a Home Office recognised financial sponsor, on the organisation's letterhead paper.

Healthcare surcharge

Students who want to apply for a student visa to study in the UK will need to pay a fee to use the National Health Service (NHS) – this is called a 'migrant health surcharge'.

DMU International College

International First Year

The International First Year is the equivalent to your first year of study at undergraduate level and is aimed at students who need less preparation before studying at DMU. Once you have successfully completed this year, you will move straight to the second year of your degree with DMU.
