Students are expected to consider their own work in relation to current published work in the same and related genres.

## About the Module:

This module provides the student with an opportunity to work with a specialist practitioner in a set genre (e.g. web-writing, radio drama, children's writing) which may vary from year to year and to submit a project in that genre. 2017-18 will be Children's writing, taught by Josephine Feeney, whose recent novel is *Gambledad*. The module is a unique opportunity to gain insight into a specific genre under the guidance of a professional writer who has detailed understanding of the marketplace

and audience for their particular specialism. You will look in detail at young readers, picture books, and fiction aimed for the 12-14 audience.

**Assessment**: Assignment 1 (Creative exercise(s) plus reflective commentary); Assignment 2 (Negotiated study plus reflective material)
