The teaching and leadership contribution will be primarily in the new BSc in Quantity Surveying and Construction and the BSc in Building Surveying but may include other courses within the School. The applicant will apply teaching to the professional context of the built environment and engage pro-actively with industry through teaching.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The post-holder will become a full-time member of staff and have access to a range of training opportunities relevant to their on-going professional development. They will be able to participate in a mentoring programme within their faculty, and undertake suitable career development activities.</li> </ul>

Publish their work in high-quality journals or monographs, or produce equivalent outputs in practice-based areas;  Administration To undertake external networking, e.g. with local business community, schools, colleges, or professional bodies (national committees), or with academic
