	Duties of the role
Overall purpose of the role	To provide academic leadership and excellent teaching contribution to the university in the area of pharmacy practice, predominantly at undergraduate level. The post holder will also be expected to support with assessments and marking, as well as contribute to the review and development of new modules and course development. As a member of the School of Pharmacy, they will be expected to contribute to the growth of the School and demonstrate good academic citizenship.

Main duties and responsibilities	The appointee will be expected to: To undertake teaching and assessment predominantly on the undergraduate Pharmacy programme, but also be involved on postgraduate pharmacy programmes when necessary. To lead and develop modules, ensuring they are authentic and current in content. To contribute to the development of relevant subject areas and related programmes of study. To develop and disseminate high quality teaching materials. To supervise dissertations/project work across the range of provision. To contribute to the research profile of the Leicester School of Pharmacy. To undertake external networking, e.g. with local business community, schools, colleges, or professional bodies (national committees), or with academic community (e.g. external examinerships). To undertake such other duties as may from time to time be specified by the Subject Lead. To participate in cross university and promotional activities such as open days, clearing and school visits. To carry out relevant administrative duties associated with the post, for example with matters related to student recruitment, enrolment, induction, teaching and assessment. Engage in a wide range of scholarly activities, including public engagement activities designed to advance the academic reputation of their Faculty, School/Department and the wider University. To participate fully in the University's Quality Assurance process relating to the discipline. This job description reflects the main duties and responsibilities of the post.
