De Montfort University, in collaboration with Channel 4, has developed and runs an innovative MA in Investigative Journalism. We are looking to find, educate and train the best of the next generation of video investigative journalists.

We are especially keen to receive applications from minority groups who are currently under-represented in broadcast journalism, such as those who are disabled, BAME candidates, and people from socially disadvantaged backgrounds, as part of the DMU Freedom Equality and Diversity Charter.

But we recognise that many talented people may not have the resources to take up a place on the course. That's why we are offering financial assistance to those successful candidates who need it most.

- A) Candidates who demonstrate that they have the capacity to succeed in the industry.
- B) Candidates who can demonstrate that they would find great difficulty in undertaking the course without financial help.
- C) Candidates from one of the targeted groups of people who are underrepresented in the industry.¹

 Investigative Journalism MA meeting the published academic and non-academic entry criteria. Please check MA course details for entry requirements
- An applicant must be regarded as a UK or EU status student for tuition fees (i.e. by DMU and Student Finance England (SFE))
- A Living Expenses Bursary is valid only for entry into the academic year of application and cannot be deferred by the applicant until a subsequent academic year
- The Bursary shall not be available to any student in a repeat year
- The Bursary shall be paid in installments in line with DMU's normal Bursary payment schedule
- An applicant must have no outstanding debt to DMU
- Students in receipt of the Bursary will not be eligible for any other scholarships or awards,
- No cash alternatives will be offered and the Bursary cannot be transferred to any other course at DMU or to a nominated recipient.
- Bursaries are only available to students responsible for paying their own fees;
